Participants will learn first-hand knowledge from Ngāti Kauwhata experts. While places are strictly limited to 24 people, we want to encourage representation from all our schools.

Last week we held our second hui for 2024 at North Street School (NSS). The focus themes they chose for this hui were **Achievement Challenge 2.1** - **To have Kaiako knowledgeable of Te Ao Māori**, and **Achievement Challenge 2.4** - **To have curious**, **confident and connected ākonga who attend regularly and experience mana-enhancing learning opportunities that support them to feel empowered and achieve success**.

It was great to hear so many examples of how their kaiako are sharing knowledge and upskilling themselves to improve their knowledge of Te Ao Māori. Walking through a selection of their classrooms also enabled us to learn more about many authentic learning opportunities that they are implementing to support their students to feel empowered and achieve success.
